RESOLUTIONS OF THE SELECTION COMMITTEE FOR NOVA LAW SCHOOL'S THIRD STUDY CYCLE LEADING TO A PHD IN LAW

7th June 2018

Selection Committee appointed by the Board on 25.05.2013 pursuant to article 5 of the Regulation of Third Cycle Studies Leading to a Phd In Law:

- Professor Teresa Pizarro Beleza (Chairperson, in her capacity as ECTS Coordinator appointed by the Scientific Board);
- Professor Ana Prata (Member);
- Professor Margarida Lima Rego (Member).

The Committee passed resolutions by exchange of emails, the following resolutions having been passed on 7th June 2018:

This is the alphabetically ordered list of the nine scholarship holders who are eligible to apply to one of the five annual mixed doctoral scholarships renewable up to maximum of three years (BD) to be granted in the 2018-2019 edition to some of the candidates whom this Committee had selected for the allocation of individual research scholarships (BI) under the Call for Applications for Individual Research and PhD Grants for Scholarships to doctoral students of the 3rd Study Cycle – PhD in Law, FCT Doctoral Programme, and who, following that selection, have entered into their respective contracts with FCT:

In addition to the above mentioned doctoral students, any doctoral students who have benefited from a BI in one of the three previous editions of this FCT Doctoral Programme and which fulfil the applicable requirements may also apply in the current edition under the same conditions applicable to the remaining BI scholars.

This Committee has set the following requirements for the granting of the BD:

- approval in all the courses of the first two semesters of the Programme with an average grade of at least 16 marks;
- successful attendance of at least two courses offered by the NOVA Doctoral School.

The Committee must assess applicants solely on merit, taking into account the following parameters and their respective weighting:

- a) arithmetic average of grades obtained during the first two semesters of the Programme (50%);
- b) quality of the research project (50%).

The nine scholarship holders who are eligible to apply to one of the five BD to be granted in this call shall be immediately informed, by email, of the contents of these minutes. If they meet the requirements stated above and wish to apply to one of the five scholarships available, they should send their application to concurso.bolsasFCT@fd.unl.pt, expressing that intention and attaching their research project and proof of completion of at least two courses offered by the NOVA Doctoral School **between 00.00 hours on 25th September 2018 and 24:00 hours on 15th October 2018**.

In order to calculate the above referred average, the relative weight to attribute to the grades obtained in each course shall be that which corresponds to their ECTS. The Committee shall assess the quality of the research projects submitted taking into account the following subcriteria:

- (i) correction and rigour of the writing (30%);
- (ii) scientific interest of the project (30%);
- and (iii) feasibility of the project's completion within the timeframe set for that purpose (40%).

The assessment of candidates on merit may include individual interviews.
